Sports Premium Funding Information 2016/2017

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has provided funding for school PE and Sport. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school gets £8000 plus £5 per child.

Schools have to spend their Sports Premium funding on improving the provision of PE and sport, but have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

Objective of Sports Premium at Staining C of E Primary School

At Staining we are strongly committed to PE. This is evident in the wide range of activities that we offer, including being involved in competitive sports. We recognise the importance of PE to the health and well-being of our children and the impact the PE curriculum and extra-curricular activities can have on the attitudes, confidence and academic achievement of all children.

How Staining C of E Primary will use the funding

Our school, along with many other primary schools in Wyre and Fylde, has decided to buy into the package put together by the Wyre and Fylde School Sports partnership (WFSSP). The WFSSP will co-ordinate the delivery of the package which consists of training for teachers, extra-curricular sports clubs and curriculum support. The cost of the package is £2700.

We have widened our range of sports on offer by bringing in coaches to work with staff to plan and deliver lessons and clubs. Sports include basketball, athletics and Military Fitness.

We have also invested in high quality resources so improve the quality of our PE and sports lessons.

How does the Sports Premium fit in with existing school sport?

Children in every class at Staining C of E Primary School participate in 2 hours of PE a week. Teachers plan lessons from the Lancashire scheme of work for PE which includes Gymnastics, Games, Dance, Outdoor and Adventurous Activities and Swimming (in Y5)

Children will continue to compete in local leagues and tournaments organised by the local Sports Association. The PE subject leader attends meetings of the association. This year, the school staff will take teams to compete in inter- school matches in football, 6-a-side football, netball, rounders, athletics and cross country.

Any staff member with an enthusiasm for a particular sport is encouraged to run a club to promote skills in that activity.

How will we evaluate impact of the extra funding?

The PE subject leader is monitoring participation in the clubs supported by the Sports Premium Funding to ensure as many pupils as possible access the clubs. In the coming academic year, the subject leader will observe lessons to ensure there is quality provision in PE and will gauge the impact of the funding.

Impact of the funding 2015-2016

As the number and range of free clubs increased, a higher proportion of our pupils accessed at least one club. Almost all pupils accessed at least one sports club last year and there was a significant increase in KS1 pupils accessing clubs as opportunities increased.

Evaluation of plans shows improvements in planning fundamental skill development.

Observations show that pupil skills are improving and these are being applied in games as pupils move up the school.

The skill levels of our pupils have increased eg in Key Stage 1 gymnastics.

More children have had the opportunity to experience competitive sports (some cluster events have been organised for children who are not usually selected for teams)

Training opportunities mean that teachers are more confident teaching PE and standards of teaching have improved. There is a wider range of activities to develop skills.
